Fred Hollows is well remembered as a skilled surgeon and a true humanitarian.

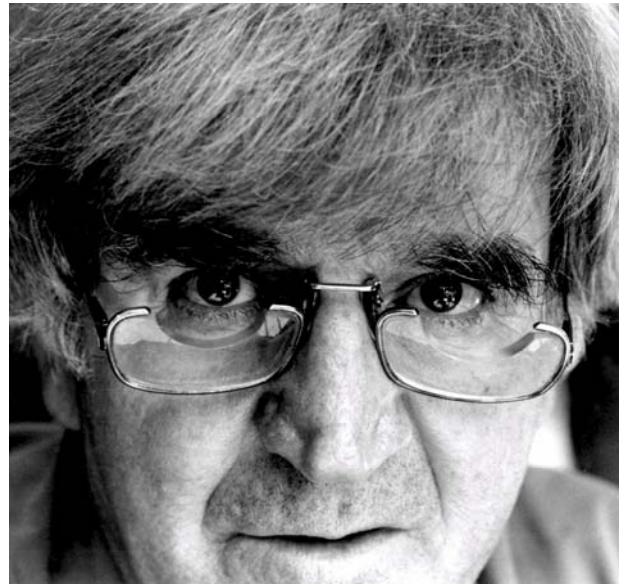
